Held in the heart of downtown Portland, the **Holiday Ale Festival** keeps attendees warm and dry under a large clear top tent that covers Pioneer Courthouse Square while allowing for views of the city lights. Gas heaters create a cozy ambience under the boughs of one of the region's largest decorated Christmas trees.

More than 50 potent winter ales are featured at this year's event, all of which are created specifically to bring warmth and cheer to the holiday season. These aren't beers you'll find in the supermarket - our brewers have put together special recipes just for the **Holiday Ale Festival**. From Belgians and Barleywines to Stouts and Sours, these beers are rich, robust and full of complex flavors.

FREE re-admission into the Festival all 5 days with wristband and current year's mug.

To enter and taste beers, the purchase of an initial tasting package is required. The package includes a souvenir mug, 12 beer tickets and costs \$35 at the door (CASH ONLY). Those that are VISIBLY INTOXICATED will not be served.

Additional beer tickets can be purchased for \$1 each. Previous years' mugs cannot be used and will not be filled; however, current year mugs can be reused on subsequent visits within the same yearly festival.

Beer News

Oregon Breweries Win 19 Medals At The 2015 Great American Beer Festival

Oregon breweries claimed a total of 19 medals at the 2015 Great American Beer Festival (GABF) held September 24th through the 26th in Denver, Colorado.

Oregon Breweries brought home 7 gold medals, 7 silver medals and 5 bronzes. The Portland Metro area brought back 7 medals, Central Oregon won 4 medals, the Willamette Valley won 3, Eastern Oregon and the Coast won 2 medals and Mt. Hood/The Gorge won one medal.

The GABF is the world's largest beer competition and recognizes the most outstanding beers that were entered in the competition from the United States. The top three medalists in each of the competition's 92 beer-style categories were announced September 26th at the 29th GABF Awards Ceremony held at the Colorado Convention Center.

The 2015 GABF Competition winners were selected by an international panel of 244 beer experts from an impressive field of 6,647 entries received from 1,572 U.S. breweries.

Awesome study says: Drinking beer makes you better at sex

A sex expert has found that drinking a few cold ones before making whoopee will help you perform better in bed.

In her recently published book, "The Married Sex Solution: A Realistic Guide to Saving Your Sex Life," Dr. Kat Van Kirk describes four different ways a man can benefit from drinking a brewskie before getting down to business, <u>according to the website AskMen.com</u>.

First, the clinical sexologist and marriage and family therapist says knocking back a few pints will help make men last longer. The beer ultimately overloads one's body with phytoestrogens from the alcohol, which are scientifically proven to delay orgasm, she says.

Next, Kirk explains how dark beers such as Guinness can boost a man's libido and lead to longer, more intense erections because of their high amounts of iron, which increases the amount of blood circulation to the penis.

She then points to studies done by Italian researchers who found that daily beer drinkers have more stamina than their sober counterparts — and are 31 percent less likely to have heart disease, heart attacks or strokes.

Lastly, Kirk points out how folks who hit the bottle won't have to worry about getting an upset stomach when the mood is right. Beer contains loads of probiotics and B vitamins, which are very good for one's digestive health.

"This means it can help fortify your overall health and be better on your stomach so you won't feel sluggish during sex," Kirk says.

She later adds that if men really want to step up their game in the bedroom, there is an actual beer that is specifically made to aid men in performance enhancement.

Dubbed "50 Shades of Green" and bottled by Innis & Gunn, the beer contains "ginseng, ginkgo biloba and damiana" — which help achieve "increased sexual desire, blood flow and nerve stimulation."

Pico poised to do for beer what Keurig did for coffee



Brewing your own beer at home is a hobby that many are no doubt interested in yet once you realize how much time, work and free space is needed to do so, you'll probably look for another hobby. Fortunately,

microbreweries are growing in popularity across the country, allowing lovers of variety to sample all sorts of local brews without the hassle of having to do all the work.

Like any hobby, there will always be people that are passionate enough about something to see it as art. For the impatient among us, well, we just want to try all sorts of different beer.

Now, there's a device that'll do just that. It's called the Pico and it's poised to do for beer what the Keurig did for coffee.

A successor to its Zymatic, the Pico from <u>PicoBrew</u> is a fully automatic craft brewing appliance. Owners start by buying a PicoPak, a pre-packaged mix of ingredients that'll produce five liters (around 14 bottles) worth of beer. After roughly two hours, all of the goods are deposited into a mini keg. All that's left is to add yeast to start the fermentation process.

A week later, your batch of craft beer is ready to be carbonated and transferred to a drinking keg for consumption.

PicoBrew has already partnered with more than 50 microbreweries to create PicoPaks. While you won't be able to brew your own recipes in the Pico just yet, the partnerships mean you'll have the opportunity to sample a variety of brews that you otherwise wouldn't get without visiting many different regions.

PicoBrew is currently seeking funding on <u>Kickstarter</u> for Pico. The company has already met its funding goal of \$200,000 with more than a month remaining in the campaign. A minimum pledge of \$499 guarantees you'll be one of the first to own a Pico (it comes with your choice of three PicoPaks) come next March.
